# A LETTER FROM THE FOUNDATION PRESIDENT



As this is my last Annual report as Foundation President, I would like to discuss what the last eleven years has meant to me and where I think the Foundation has gone under the direction of the Board in those years.

As I look back I remember the first year as Trustee, and how little I was asked to do or learned about the Foundation. There was one meeting that year, the Annual meeting only! Imagine that happening today? No, I cannot.

When I was elected President in 2012, I decided that no Trustee would sit on the Board and never hear from me. Many things about the Board have changed since that year and the following are a few things I am most proud of that the Board worked together and made happen.

1. We created three to four regularly scheduled meetings each year, one usually zoom.
2. We created a regular Zoom link for anyone who cannot attend the meetings in person, opening the Board up to Brothers to get involved who are not close to our meeting sites.
3. We have pushed the Committees to have regular meetings and they now do. Most every committee meets at least six times a year.
4. We set a precedent to support the AXP Chapters owning houses and can now, in some cases have loans available for houses which can support loans, while the Board does its fiduciary duty to protect our investments.
5. We have approved a new Investment plan, which was created by Andy Borner and his crew. They have kept it up to date and because of it our investments are thriving rather than falling behind each year.
6. The Foundation is now on the road to positive budget balances because we have finally grappled with what our budgets should look like, are raising more funds through higher donations from you, and because of the audit process we can now count on income from investments.
7. The Long-Range Plan for the Foundation which was completed a few years ago, with the help of Byron Connell, Nancy Jones, and Michael Giardinelli and their team is so important to the future of our Foundation is bright. Getting this done with minimal expense when being told it couldn't be done without the cash, was important and the Committee did a great Job. The consistent review of this plan is a must for every Board in the future to keep the Foundation on track.
8. New scholarships, which are funded with new money, were established by the Board. After many years of the status quo, Jay Anhorn cultivated donors who wanted to memorialize Brothers through the foundation and several scholarships were created with agreements and payouts that are not funded by the Foundation but by the income from the donations to the particular scholarship funds. This was so important for our growing Foundation and the Brotherhood as a whole.
9. Creation of a website which is only one or two clicks away from a donation was important as well. Now Brothers can donate with one click and pay the fees which we used to pay all of.
10. We have allowed donors who are not Brothers become involved with the Board as a Trustee if they wish.
11. The Garnett Knight Challenge was started, which I believe is very important to the grass roots fundraising efforts of the Foundation! I think this can be a huge addition by getting more Brothers and their families involved with support of the Foundation, don't let it be forgotten.

These and many other items over the ten years have been started, some have continued others have fallen by the wayside. Not all should have been forgotten, but it just seemed like there was not enough buy in to push to assure they continued. However, I have to say that I believe the Foundation is in a much better place today as I step down as President, than the day I stepped up and became President! I want to assure you that this improvement was not because of any problems with past Presidents or Boards, but rather that the stars were aligned during my Presidency. I also want to say I did not do any of this on my own, there were so many individuals who worked hard to assure success!

I must thank all the members of the Board especially Byron Connell who I knew I could always call on to get something done. I also need to thank Scott Carlson who, has been a good friend and Brother for forty years. He was at my side from the beginning when I asked the question "How can we continue to have 200-to-300-thousand-dollar losses and expect to continue?" He said we have to work on that and came up with some ideas. He also was a guide when for 3 years we had no Director of Development and we did it all ourselves with a lot of help from Barbara Bianchi. I know how Scott is able to do what he does because of her. Barbara helped me so much by proofing my letters assuring the list of donors was sent to me so I could make a phone call to all of them. She was instrumental in assuring the Foundation's success.

Thank you, Jay Anhorn. In his five years as Director of Development we saw the Foundation make so much forward progress. His years as DOD were instrumental to changing the Foundation for the better in so many ways I can't even list them.

The Bedfords, Ruth and Stan are even after they have passed, so important to the Foundation. They are much of the reason we are moving our budget more into the Black. The estate which they left will be instrumental in assuring success of AXPEF into the future. Thank you.

Lastly, I want to thank all of you who have donated anything or have volunteered your time to the Foundation over the last 10 years. You are the unsung heroes who just give to assure young men today get to have the same experience as you had back in the day. Thank you all for these 10 years, they have been special.

# WHY VOLUNTEER?

Volunteering is a service freely given and freely received. Free is good. It's often the only compensation organizations can offer even their most dedicated contributors. It's enjoyable to share your time and talents for free; the pressure is off, and you can offer a hand just because you want to. You can find any number of inspiring quotes, articles, and speeches highlighting the many tangible benefits of volunteering: Feeling good, improved health and well-being, and societal growth and improvement. Great! Problem solved: volunteering is free, it feels good, it's good for all parties involved, so everyone should be volunteering as much as possible.

Wait... that isn't right. The reality is that volunteering is hard. I want to elaborate a bit about why and how I've come to think about volunteering differently as a result. If we do this right, hopefully we can make giving and receiving freely through volunteerism a bit easier.

Volunteering feels good, and it is a core tenet of the Foundation's success, so why is it so hard? Although it is free, it is a service. Volunteering is work, and work can be hard. Managing volunteers is the highest privilege and responsibility of the Foundation, but assuring the right work is identified, organized, and paired with the right volunteers is a persistent challenge.

Assuring that volunteers see themselves making a difference for the Foundation is absolutely crucial, but it can take a long time to see the results. Like any other type of hard work, it can leave volunteers feeling tired, stressed, pressured to over-commit, like they're ignoring other obligations, or otherwise worse off for the experience.

I have felt this way about volunteering, and I couldn't figure out why. Over time, I found three questions that I asked myself before volunteering. Answering those questions honestly helped me give freely and realize the benefits that volunteering offers.

Ask:

- "Can I afford it?" Can I afford the time to show up when and where I need to be and with the resources, I am responsible for to be an effective volunteer? If the answer is yes, I will consider volunteering. If the answer is no, I decline, but usually not without at least asking you to keep me in mind for the future.
- "Do I want to be part of this mission?" Can I get behind the end result I am helping to build with my time? If the answer is yes, I'm excited. However, whether it's timing, beliefs, or other obligations, there are some missions I just couldn't commit to. When I said yes anyway, I found myself less a part of the community I was helping while I was serving, and the work got harder the longer I did it. The right thing to do is decline and keep your energy for the next time.
- The final question, best asked of existing volunteers, is "did they say thank you?" Volunteers are mission critical to success for communities that are receiving their service. The communities and organizations that are the best to volunteer for will always, always find a way to say thank you clearly and meaningfully.

Answering these three questions led me to volunteer for the Alpha Chi Rho Foundation. Can I afford it? As a husband and father of two, any expenditure of time is a gift, but I've found it makes me more well-rounded when I focus on those important priorities. Do I want to be part of this mission? I committed to being a member for life, and the Foundation provides a new way to give back to the undergraduates in our Fraternity. Did they say thank you? They did, and they made me feel welcome.

So, what comes next? The Foundation is a non-profit organization that relies on volunteers to manage its limited resources. We are asking you to become a volunteer. Please ask yourself these questions before giving us an answer so you are prepared to give freely. Please ask us for our plan when you answer so we can prove we are prepared to receive freely. Thank you!

# AXPEF PRESIDENT SPOTLIGHT

## Gary DelPiano, Sigma Phi '77

Gary DelPiano has been President of the Educational Foundation for 11 years, having been first elected in 2012 and serving continuously until 2023. During that time, Gary led a transformation of AXPEF that has made it truly able to cultivate "academic excellence and leadership development through financial assistance and program support for the educational pursuits and initiatives of the Brothers, Chapters, the National Council" and others.

A 1977 graduate of Southern Connecticut State College, Brother DelPiano was initiated in 1974. He has been his Chapter's president and both a Resident [Undergraduate] Councilor and a Graduate Councilor on the National Council of the Fraternity. In 2011 he was elected a Trustee.

Under Gary's leadership, the Foundation:

- Wrote a new statement of its mission.
- Adopted a home-grown long-range plan to guide it in meeting its mission.
- Added new funded scholarships and grants.
- Amended its Bylaws to specify a minimum annual financial contribution by elected Trustees.
- Amended the Bylaws to authorize persons who are not Brothers but have made major financial contributions to AXPEF to serve as Trustees.
- Added a fourth regular meeting of the Board in the spring between its winter and fall meetings.
- Made all Board meetings hybrid in-person/virtual meetings, enabling participation by Trustees living outside the Northeast.
- Held regular virtual monthly meetings of its Executive Committee to carry out the Foundation's business between Board meetings.
- Gave new vitality to the Board's standing and special committees, requiring regular monthly committee meetings (usually virtual) followed by brief reports to the President of business conducted at the meeting.
- Has worked to cut its annual financial deficit according to a timetable in the Long-Range Plan to bring it back to fiscal balance over five years.



As Chairman, I thank Gary for his years of service to the Foundation and for all the good things he has caused to happen.

# CHAPTER COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

## CHAPTER COMMUNITY GRANT AWARDED BY AXPEF

**Phi Lambda - Penn State and Phi Mu Chi – Lock Haven – both received a Community Program Grant Award up to \$500.**

Phi Lambda - Penn State hosted a haunted house event that took place at 425 Locust. The Phi Lambda Chapter and Club Gymnastics paired together creating a thrilling tour of the Fraternity house. Brothers and members of the club gymnastics team decorated the house, had actors, and spooked anyone that entered the Murder House. Admission was \$10 and the proceeds went to THON.

THON is where students, volunteers, and Four Diamonds families join in Penn State's Bryce Jordan Center. For 46 hours, volunteers give kids and their families the opportunity to forget about their cancer diagnosis. 700+ students are recognized as dancers for THON Weekend, a feat that entails standing on their feet for the entirety of the weekend.

Phi Mu Chi - Lock Haven tabled for a week to support the awareness of testicular cancer. This effort continues to support the Alexander C. Bartlett "Well" Endowment that has raised over \$75,000 that will support 3 scholarships per year.

Thank you Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation for sponsoring me for NGLA.

## 1. What was your favorite session and why?

My favorite session, of all the sessions, was “Inspire Integrity: Chase An Authentic [Greek] Life”. The speaker, Corey Clocchetti, was very engaging and he kept my interest the entire time. The content about priorities, happiness, and life in general was very eye opening and it still has me thinking. This event is something that will change my outlook on life for the better. This conference taught me a lot of recruitment and leadership tactics that I did not know, especially since this is my first full semester as a Brother. I’ve learned a lot of recruitment strategies and some “do’s and don’t’s” of recruitment, and this will be especially helpful since I am planning to run for the Recruitment Co-chair. I’ve also learned a few good practices overall for our Chapter to improve. This was mostly thanks to the “Leading with Grit”, “Isn’t this For Life? How to Boost Retention & Better Engage Members”, “Ready. Set. Recruit. – Strategies for Successful Fraternity Recruitment”, and the “You Be the Letters” educational sessions.

## 2. What is one thing you learned during NGLA that you didn’t know before?

In a non-Chapter related manner, I’ve learned a lot about myself from the “Inspire Integrity” and the Emotional Intelligence sessions. I’ve learned ways that I could improve myself further as a person and those around me.

The “Inspire Integrity” and the Emotional Intelligence seminars really allowed me to reflect on myself and how I could improve.

My self esteem is normally pretty low, and the Emotional Intelligence sessions showed me how to have a more positive outlook on life. These sessions also taught me how to be less introverted and break out of my shell even further. The Inspire Integrity allowed me to think a lot about my future, how to have a happy and healthy future, and what I should prioritize, and how I could avoid a bad future.

## 3. What is one thing you’re going to improve about your membership experience and one thing you’re going to try and implement in your Chapter after this conference?

As I mentioned earlier, I’ve learned a lot about recruitment and leadership. Since recruitment is something I’ve been interested in pursuing, I found a lot of applicable knowledge I could bring back to our Chapter regarding recruitment. I’ve also learned about some good and bad practices to acknowledge, some retention strategies, and how we could spread awareness of minorities, injustice, and shed light to multicultural organizations.

My mom is one of the strongest and most hard working people I have ever met, and I think she is one of the main influences on my perception of what it means to be both a man and successful.

## 3. What is one thing you’re going to improve about your membership experience and one thing you’re going to try and implement in your Chapter after this conference?

One thing that I plan on applying for the rest of my undergraduate experience is utilizing my leadership skills gained through Greek life in order to create a very solid resume, as many Greek life skills are very marketable skills. It just all depends on how you phrase it.

One thing I gained from the conference that I plan on bringing back to my Chapter is how to make their time investments yield positive results. ## 2. What is one thing you learned during NGLA that you didn't know before?

### 1. What was your favorite session and why?


# PATRICK MCGOEY MEMORIAL FUND

An exceptional hockey player and teammate he touched many during his time as a member of the hockey family of Bridgton Academy, PHA Iceman, Seneca Valley, and North Pittsburgh Wildcats. Patrick was a friend to everyone he met. He was happiest on the ice; skates laced up and stick in his hands. He will be remembered for his smile and love of the game.

Patrick (we called him Patch) was a talented hockey player! He played on club teams since he was 4 years old and played for the Seneca Valley Middle School, JV, and Varsity teams, as well as for the Bridgton Academy team in Maine. This picture is of Patch after his club team won the Ides of March Tournament which was hosted by the University of Notre Dame. There is a lot of tradition at Notre Dame, a lot of stories about famed athletes, students who went on to do great things in their lives, and a strong sense of community that you don't find at many schools. Patch loved being at Notre Dame for the Ides of March Tournament for those reasons and more. I loved watching my son play the game he loved on Notre Dame ice with a group of boys who weren't just friends but extended family to us. The biggest reason I decided to establish this scholarship is to allow undergraduate brothers, who are athletically inclined, the ability to experience what my son experienced as an athlete. Patch's legacy will endure.

To celebrate his memory Brother McGoeY has established a memorial fund in Patrick's name to celebrate and support active undergraduate Brothers who are engaged in intercollegiate, or club athletics and are also high academic achievers. In the event there is no recipient of the scholarship in a given year, the funds could be used to provide an educational program that supports mental health or suicide prevention to the Brotherhood.

We support the Fraternity's InDeed Institute, held each non-Convention year to educate the Fraternity's future leaders in terms of Character, Honor, and Integrity and the meaning of our Landmarks.



We support the travel expenses of resident Brothers attending the Northeast Greek Leadership Association's annual Leadership Conference and contribute support for its educational mission.



We manage Educational Use Grants to Chapters that dedicate a portion of their House to educational purposes, supported by major donations provided specifically for each grant.



We also provide grants to Chapters to support the growth of their libraries, help pay for educational speakers, reimburse expenses incurred in carrying out their own charitable activities, cover the cost of induction into campus honor societies, and pay for PPE supplies such as masks and sanitizers.



We encourage every resident Chapter to find a Scholarship Advisor by reimbursing the Advisor for part of their time and giving the Chapter a matching grant.



We annually grant the National Fraternity funds to meet its programs and services that support our mission, including anti-hazing programs and supporting educational activities for Colonies and Chapters.
