"The whole idea of being there for Brothers in need reflects the values of Alpha Chi Rho. Many members struggle privately, and this is a tangible way we can demonstrate that we're there for one another."

He hopes this fund will leave a lasting legacy by not only helping those in need today but also inspiring future recipients to stay involved with the Fraternity, the Foundation, and to give back in their own ways.

As a higher education professional, John's passion for supporting students drives his work. He finds fulfillment in building relationships and empowering students to succeed, noting that his own experiences in college laid the foundation for his career.

"Higher education is a lot of work, but it's incredibly rewarding. Supporting students and ensuring they have a great experience throughout college is something I find deeply meaningful."



John's involvement extends to programs like the Indeed Institute and partnerships with organizations like NGLA (Northeast Greek Leadership Association).
