All of the nominated men have made an impact in their Chapters, schools, and communities. They have made Alpha Chi Rho stronger. We are truly proud to call them Brothers. The winner of this award joins a humble but elite group of Brothers who went above and beyond what it means to be a Brother of this Fraternity.

This year's recipient is a rising senior studying mechanical engineering. He is selfless with his knowledge and time, aiding fellow classmates and underclassmen as a teaching assistant for classes he's taken or in the same field. He received an academic scholarship last year from the University's Mechanical Engineering College and he is a member of the national engineering honor society, Tau Beta Pi. To be admitted to Tau Beta Phi, a student must have a GPA within the top 12.5% of all engineering disciplines at the University, which shows his dedication to his studies.

This year's recipient conducts undergraduate research at his University with soft tissue biomechanics, specifically predicting and modeling post-breast cancer lumpectomy surgeries. He also works with two professors and a PhD student to perform data collection and analysis using Python.

This individual has contributed over one-hundred-fifty hours of community service to multiple philanthropic organizations, most notably Habitat for Humanity. He has also volunteered at Natalie's Second Chance Dog Shelter, Food Finders (a local charity that helps the homeless and less fortunate acquire food), and the Westwood Bergen Habitat for Humanity ReStore near his

hometown. Every Saturday or Sunday, this individual collects cardboard and mixed materials in the local area to recycle.

This year's winner is a prominent member of his Chapter. He is entering his second term as Chapter treasurer. As the treasurer for his Chapter, he oversees a \$100,000+ yearly budget and works with his comptroller and executive board to ensure that the Chapter is fiscally responsible. Through his tenure, the Chapter has reduced dues by 20% and increased savings by 40%. He is levelheaded, focused, ambitious, and a role model to other Brothers and officers. One recent example of his work ethic is that during spring break he spent countless hours to ensure that the spring formal venue was not overcharging or overselling the Chapter because they were "a bunch of college guys". Through his repeated conversations with the venue, he was able to pay for the spring formal without charging members an exorbitant amount to attend.

This Brother is one of the most thoughtful Brothers in his Chapter. He never backs down from a challenge, proposes new ideas, and pushes his peers to do more and better. He embodies every Landmark and value of the Fraternity. As the Chapter president says, "I have come to learn that even though [this individual] has a 'tough guy' appearance, he deeply cares for each Brother's wellbeing and success.
