The winner of this award joins a humble but elite group of Brothers who went above and beyond what it means to be a Brother of this Fraternity.

This year's receipient academically has been on the President's List in all four of his semesters in college, boasting a 4.0 cumulative GPA. He has been recognized as a University Honors and Scholars member, which is designed to allow high achieving individuals to find more success after college.

On campus, he has worked with Residential Life to improve the quality of drinking water across campus to more sustainable and healthy levels.

Within the community, he has completed over 35 hours during the last academic year. He participated in various events throughout his collegeiate career but last year he helped with a Walk for Food Insecurity, a town-wide clean up program, and at the local Habitat for Humanity branch.

Within the Chapter, he has held the position of Recruitment Chair and Social Officer. He is currently the Chapter's Brother-at-Large. As Recruitment Chair, he reframed and redefined the mindset of the Chapter's members and the outcomes of the overall program. Doing this saw the Chapter's size increase by 75%.
