



Continued engagement through the Ambassador Program increases awareness of the many ways the Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation can financially support Chapters and individual Brothers through our competitive scholarships, loans, and Chapter grants.



Implemented a new cloud-based Customer Relationship Management (CRM). This system enhances our ability to communicate with donors and improve donor reporting capabilities.



Launched a new corporate sponsorship website and brochure. These promotional tools showcase ways to add to our endowment through corporate matching gift programs and other sponsorship opportunities.



Conducted an assessment of the National Headquarters location and structure. The Foundation is renovating the National Office to become ADA compliant and a better place to entertain, support, and serve the Brotherhood.

R.B. STEWART DAY



Since 2017, the Educational Foundation has honored the legacy of R. B. Stewart (Phi Omicron, 1923) through a day of giving on his birthday, March 31. On average, the Educational Foundation raises \$15,000 each year on this day. In 2023, the Educational Foundation raised \$16,276.85 from seventy-nine donors! The average gift was \$206.04. WHERE DOES MY MONEY GO?

Donors frequently seek the answers to two questions: "Do you really need my money?" and "Where does my donation go?".

Your donation helps cultivate academic excellence, develop leadership, and support individual growth, maturity and well-being through scholarships, grants, and loans.

Services for Individual Brothers:



Every year, we award twelve competitive scholarships of up to \$4,000 to undergraduate Brothers to support the cost of their academic growth. Four graduate Brothers seeking advanced education receive scholarships of \$3,500 each.



We provide low-interest loans of up to \$3,500 to undergraduate and graduate students.



Members can receive a grant for initiation fees for most educational honor societies.

Services for Chapters:



All resident Chapters with a Scholarship (Faculty) Advisor are eligible for a Scholarship Advisor grant to both the Chapter and Advisor.



Additional grants are available to Chapters to support the growth of their libraries, reimburse expenses from their own charitable activities, help pay for educational speakers, and reimburse expenditures that improve their health and safety.



Educational Area Use Grants are available to Chapters that dedicate a portion of their Chapter facility to educational purposes.

Services for the Brotherhood:



The Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation supports the National Fraternity's educational programs and services, including anti-hazing programs, leadership development, and life skills training.



Support is provided to the Fraternity for the InDeed Institute, which educates our emerging leaders in Character, Honor, and Integrity, and the Winter Conclave which educates newly elected officers.



Scholarships are provided to resident Brothers attending the Northeast Greek Leadership Association's (NGLA) annual leadership conference. Since 2018, Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation has helped sponsor NGLA's mission.
