MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS

Leadership Development: The Fraternity offers year-round leadership modules covering a variety of topics regarding Chapter operations such as time management, fiscal responsibility, and networking.

Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation



The Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation was established in 1950 in the state of Delaware. The Foundation provides a variety of services, including scholarships, loans, grants, leadership programs and educational seminars.

SERVICES OFFERED

Loans - up to \$3,500 for full-time juniors and seniors who meet a 2.8 GPA or higher or for full or part-time students in an accredited graduate program.

Scholarships - 12 scholarships available per year ranging from \$500 to \$4,000

Individual and Chapter Grants - reimbursement of Honor Society Initiation Fees, Chapter grants on educational programs, community service, and educational resources.

Postulant Fee - Postulant Manual, Pin and Liability Insurance; One-time, non-refundable. Due at Bid Acceptance.

Initiation Fee - 10K Gold Plated Brother Badge, Membership Certificate, Garnet and White; Due prior to initiation.

Per Capita Fee - Membership Development Courses, recruitment assets, Anti-Hazing education and a financial management platform for all members.

Chapter Assessment - Supports the National Fraternity's services and resources to all members.

Liability Insurance - Coverage for social, service and other Chapter-sponsored events.

**Average local Chapter dues vary by institution and include funds for social and recruitment events.*

IMPROVING SOCIETY

Our National Philanthropy program, Challenge the World, supports Habitat for Humanity, the JED Foundation, and the Gift of Life Marrow Registry. All members of the Fraternity are required to do at least 10 hours of service per year. All Chapters are required to raise \$500 for a charitable organization each year. Resident Chapter members are also encouraged to provide service to local philanthropic organizations to benefit their respective local communities.



Each Chapter is connected with their local branch of Habitat for Humanity in order to help with build weekends, fundraisers, or at the Re-Store which sells refurbished furniture.



The JED Foundation provides resources to college students to help themselves and others when discussing and dealing with mental health, substance abuse, and suicide prevention.



Gift of Life Marrow Registry is a public bone marrow and blood stem cell registry headquartered in Boca Raton, Florida. Gift of Life facilitates transplants for children and adults suffering from life-threatening illnesses, including leukemia, lymphoma, other cancers and genetic diseases.
