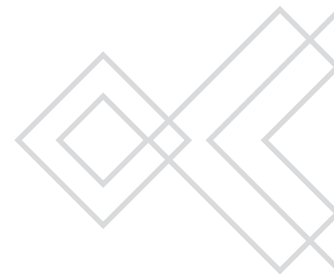

2024: A YEAR OF REFLECTION AND INVESTMENT

The past year was one of reflection and strategic investment – an opportunity to assess our position as we approach the Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation's 75th anniversary. It was also a year of forward-thinking, as we evaluated how to maintain our relevance and continue providing meaningful value to our Brothers and the communities we serve.

At the start of 2024, we welcomed Nicholas Ramos (Theta Chi Phi, 2020) as our new Marketing and Communications Manager. Under his leadership, we have expanded our social media presence, enhanced communication with our supporters, and updated key marketing materials to strengthen our outreach efforts.

We were also fortunate to welcome new and returning volunteers, both Resident and Graduate Brothers. They have brought fresh perspectives, challenged us to strive for excellence, and reinforced our commitment to continuous improvement.

Recognizing the importance of preserving our heritage, we invested in the R. B. Stewart National Headquarters, ensuring the integrity of its structure and safeguarding the history it represents. Additionally, we established new scholarships and grants, including the Outstretched Hand Emergency Fund, which provides critical financial assistance to Resident Brothers in times of need. We also increased the borrowing limit for our student loan program, addressing a 25-year gap and making financial support more accessible to those pursuing their education.

In many ways, 2024 was a foundational year for AXPEF. One that strengthened our infrastructure, expanded our impact, and positioned us for future growth. I am deeply grateful for the dedication of our volunteers, staff, Trustees, and the Fraternity, and I look forward to building on this momentum in the year ahead.

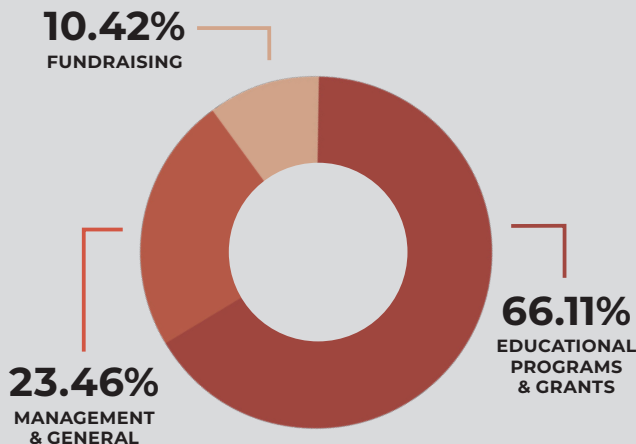
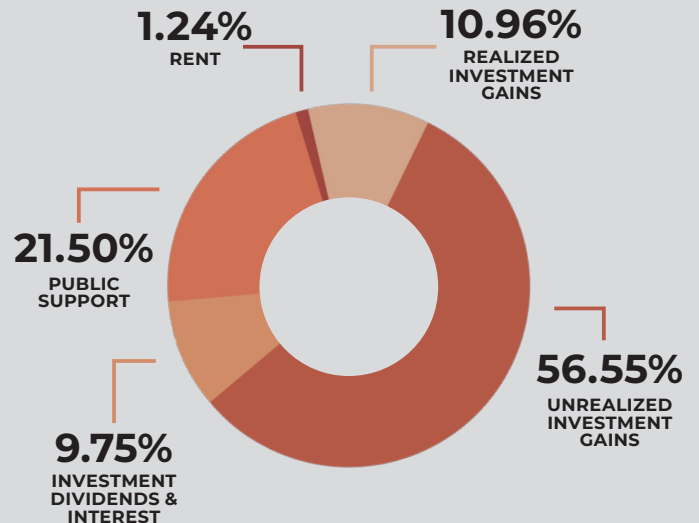

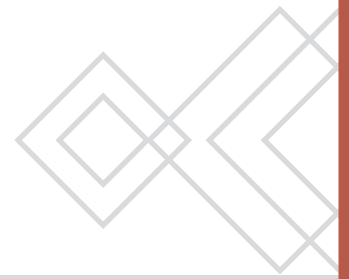

THE MISSION IS EVERYTHING



In 2025, the Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation will celebrate its 75th anniversary – an exciting milestone that you will hear more about in the coming months. However, we want to take a moment to highlight a more recent and significant development: the adoption of our revised mission statement five years ago.

The mission of the Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation is to cultivate academic excellence and leadership development by providing financial assistance and program support for the educational pursuits and initiatives of the Brothers, Chapters, the National Council of the Fraternity of Alpha Chi Rho, and other students. The Foundation fosters a lifelong commitment to personal enrichment and community service by members of Alpha Chi Rho as Men of Word and Deed.

Our mission serves as the guiding principle for everything we do, directing our investments of time, resources, and financial support.

Following the adoption of this refined mission, the Board of Trustees took deliberate steps to ensure our actions aligned with these objectives. In 2021, we approved a long-range strategic plan covering 2022–2026, which outlined twenty key objectives. By 2024, we successfully completed five of these goals and made substantial progress on fourteen others, while discontinuing two objectives that were better addressed by the National Fraternity.

Over the past five years, we have continued to provide financial support to the National Fraternity, its Resident Chapters, and particularly to newly-Chartered Chapters. We remain committed to awarding scholarships and offering loans to Resident and Graduate Brothers in need of financial assistance to further their education. Additionally, several new scholarships are being established, and we recognize the ongoing need to expand these opportunities.

In every initiative, we carefully evaluate whether it is best executed by our dedicated volunteer Trustees and supporters or by professional staff. We have also invested in the maintenance and enhancement of our Headquarters at 109 Oxford Way in Neptune, New Jersey, which serves as the home of both the Foundation and the National Fraternity.

None of this would be possible without the generosity of our donors and the dedication of our volunteers. Your gifts and active involvement allow us to fulfill our mission and support the Brothers of Alpha Chi Rho.

This report provides an overview of our accomplishments in 2024. We welcome your feedback, your questions, and your continued support as we work together to advance our mission.

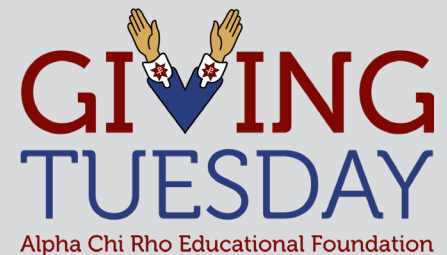

GIVING TUESDAY

Giving Tuesday, the international day of giving, occurs the Tuesday after Thanksgiving to kick off end of year giving. Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation has participated in Giving Tuesday since 2017. In 2024, the Educational Foundation raised \$9,757.27 from fifty-three donors! The average donation per donor was \$184.10. Thank you for your continued support!



R.B. STEWART DAY



Since 2017, the Educational Foundation has honored the legacy of R. B Stewart (Phi Omicron, 1923), through a day of giving on his birthday, March 31. On average, the Educational Foundation raises \$15,000 each year on this day. In 2024, the Educational Foundation raised \$16,459.30 from sixty-four donors! The average gift was \$257.18. Congratulations as well to the Phi Lambda Chapter at Penn. State University for winning the Resident Chapter competition. Thank you to all the Resident and Graduate Brothers that participated!

WHERE DOES MY MONEY GO?

Your donation helps cultivate academic excellence, develop leadership, and support individual growth, maturity and well-being through scholarships, grants, and loans.

Services for Individual Brothers:



Annually, we award \$44,500 in competitive scholarships for Resident and Graduate Brothers. These scholarships offset the cost of their academic growth and advance education.



We provide low-interest loans of up to \$7,000 to undergraduate and graduate students.



Members can receive a grant for initiation fees for most educational honor societies.

Services for Chapters:



All resident Chapters with a Scholarship (Faculty) Advisor are eligible for a Scholarship Advisor grant to both the Chapter and Advisor.



Additional grants are available to Chapters to support the growth of their libraries, reimburse expenses from their own charitable activities, help pay for educational speakers, and reimburse expenditures that improve their health and safety.



Educational Area Use Grants are available to Chapters that dedicate a portion of their Chapter facility to educational purposes.

Services for the Brotherhood:



The Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation supports the National Fraternity's educational programs and services, including anti-hazing programs, leadership development, and life skills training.



Support is provided to the Fraternity for the InDeed Institute, which educates our emerging leaders in Character, Honor, and Integrity, and the Winter Conclave which educates newly elected officers.



Scholarships are provided to resident Brothers attending the Northeast Greek Leadership Association's (NGLA) annual leadership conference. Since 2018, Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation has helped sponsor NGLA's mission.

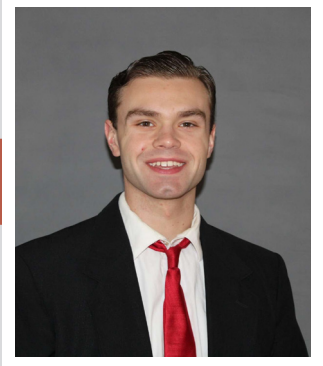
