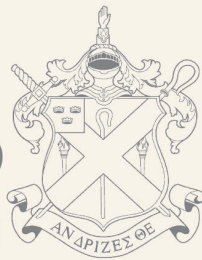

# AXPEF PRESIDENT'S PEN

As we celebrate the 130th year of our dear old Alpha Chi, the Foundation marks its 75th year of supporting the educational pursuits of the Brotherhood, a significant milestone indeed! Milestones are exciting to reach; but more than just marking where you are, they let you know how far you have come and how far you have yet to go.

The Foundation has come far indeed! This year, the Foundation will surpass one million dollars in scholarships awarded to more than five hundred undergraduate and graduate members. Additionally, the Foundation has provided more than three and a half million dollars in student loans to over two thousand undergraduate and graduate students. The Foundation now has seventeen endowed academic scholarships, and recently introduced the Outstretched Hand Emergency Fund as a new and valuable means for assisting Resident Brothers. The Foundation has also grown its support for educational programming and grants for both the National Fraternity and Chapters.

All of this was made possible by the incredible generosity and dedication of our Brothers and those closest to them who understood their love for Alpha Chi Rho...from its inception and incorporation seventy-five years ago by Brothers Patchell, Cox, Hammond, and Horlacher through to the Foundation's present-day donors, volunteers, staff, and Trustees. They all believed in the mission of the Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation and chose to invest in its members and their communities. Our mission serves as the guiding principle for everything we do, directing our investments of time, resources, and financial support.

However far the Foundation has come, it has much further to go. One of the most important charges for the Board of Trustees is how to maintain the Foundation's relevance today and in the future. To that end, five years ago, the Foundation renewed its mission statement and put forth a long-range strategic plan for 2022-2026 to position itself for future success. The Foundation is also well on its way to planning for the years that follow. One of the leaders of our preparations for the future was Nancy Jones.

Unfortunately, Nancy Jones passed away in April 2025. Nancy served on Foundation Committees since 2019 and as the first female Trustee since 2021. In 2006, Nancy established the Donald F. Jones Scholarships in memory of her husband, past National President and former Chairman of the Educational Foundation, Donald F. Jones, Alpha Phi '68. Don was a leader and mentor to many. Nancy was no different - she was a skilled businesswoman and non-profit leader who helped shape the Educational Foundation as we know it today. She worked tirelessly to define the organizational mission, strategic planning and outreach through the ambassador program.

The Foundation has much to celebrate as it turns seventy-five, and much to accomplish to ensure it can celebrate many more milestones in the years ahead. As ever, thank you to our volunteers, staff, Trustees, and the Fraternity for all they have done and will do in the future.

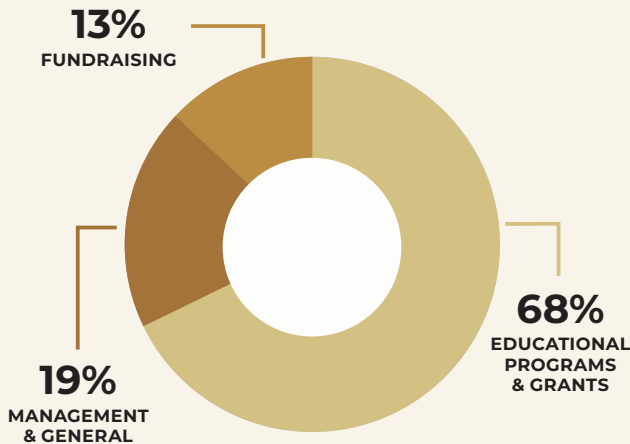
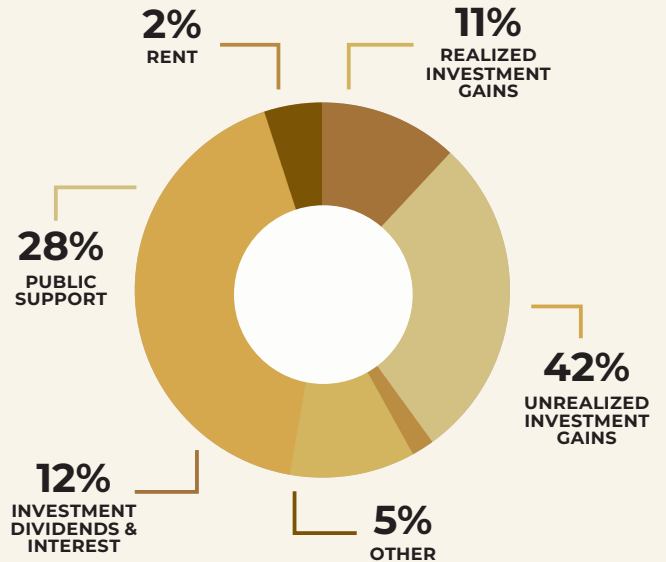

The Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation celebrated its 75th anniversary last fall and we're still carrying that celebration forward. Milestones like this offer a chance not only to reflect on our history, but also to look ahead with purpose.

In my view, one of the most significant steps we took in 2025 was adopting a balanced budget for 2026, ensuring that our projected expenditures do not exceed anticipated revenue. This achievement fulfills an important goal outlined in our long-range plan. Of course, any budget is an estimate, and our success will ultimately be measured by how closely our actual revenues and expenses align in the year ahead.

We also completed several important repairs and enhancements to the R. B. Stewart National Headquarters located in Neptune. These improvements help preserve our home and strengthen the Foundation's operations for years to come.

In 2019, my fellow Trustees elected me Chairman of the Board, and I have been honored by their continued confidence each year since. Serving alongside dedicated Brothers to advance the Foundation's mission and implement our Long-Range Plan has been deeply rewarding. After six years as Chairman, I chose to step down on December 31, 2025, due to age (84) and health considerations. I am grateful for the opportunity to continue serving as a Trustee for as long as our members will have me.

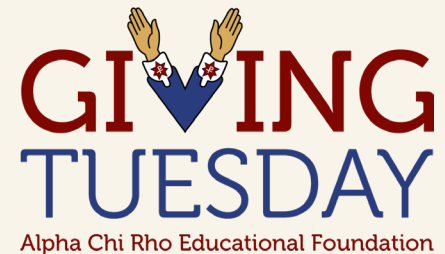

Giving Tuesday, the international day of giving, occurs the Tuesday after Thanksgiving to kick off end of year giving. Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation has participated in Giving Tuesday since 2017. In 2025, the Educational Foundation raised \$9,927 from fifty-three donors! ## R.B. STEWART DAY



Since 2017, the Educational Foundation has honored the legacy of R. B Stewart (Phi Omicron, 1923), through a day of giving on his birthday, March 31. On average, the Educational Foundation raises \$15,000 each year on this day. In 2025, the Educational Foundation raised \$8,235.07 from forty-eight donors! The average gift was \$171.56. Congratulations as well to the Rochester Institute of Technology Colony for winning the resident competition.

# WHERE DOES MY MONEY GO?

Your donation helps cultivate academic excellence, develop leadership, and support individual growth, maturity and well-being through scholarships, grants, and loans.

## Services for Individual Brothers:



Annually, we award \$49,500 in competitive scholarships for Resident and Graduate Brothers. These scholarships offset the cost of their academic growth and advance education.



We provide low-interest loans of up to \$7,000 to undergraduate and graduate students.



Members can receive a grant for initiation fees for most educational honor societies.

## Services for Chapters:



All resident Chapters with a Scholarship (Faculty) Advisor are eligible for a Scholarship Advisor grant to both the Chapter and advisor.



Additional grants are available to Chapters to support the growth of their libraries, reimburse expenses from their own charitable activities, help pay for educational speakers, and reimburse expenditures that improve their health and safety.



Educational Area Use Grants are available to Chapters that dedicate a portion of their Chapter facility to educational purposes.

## Services for the Brotherhood:



The Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation supports the National Fraternity's educational programs and services, including anti-hazing programs, leadership development, and life skills training.



Support is provided to the Fraternity for the InDeed Institute, which educates our emerging leaders in Character, Honor, and Integrity, and the Winter Conclave which educates newly elected officers.



Scholarships are provided to resident Brothers attending the Northeast Greek Leadership Association's (NGLA) annual leadership conference. Since 2018, Alpha Chi Rho Educational Foundation has helped sponsor NGLA's mission.

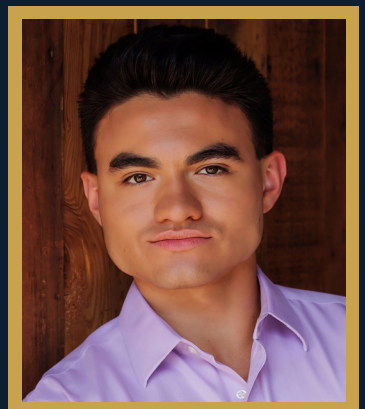
